KARI IHALAINEN, World Class and Olympic Coach, has been coaching world class athletes since 1990. Once world class athlete himself, he coached for the Finnish National and Olympic Track and Field teams at their Olympic training center in Kuortane for 15 years. Kari has coached 1 gold, 2 silver and three bronze Olympic medalists, three world champions and two world record holders. Kari was also in charge of overseeing the development of Finnish junior teams and was responsible for developing training regimens for international throwers who traveled to Finland for his expertise. Kari is the author of numerous articles and books regarding training and performance. He is internationally recognized as one of the top throwing coaches in history and is sought after around the world for his knowledge of training, performance and rehabilitation. Kari moved from Finland to USA 2006 and coached top athletes (like WCh 3. 2007 Breaux Greer, PB 91,29) until 2008. From USA he moved to Korea (2008-2011) and worked there as National Coach. Now he is back in Finland and Kuortane and continues his work as the National Coach for Finnish Athletics.



VERN GAMBETTA is currently the Director of Gambetta Sports Training Systems. As a pioneer in the field he is considered the father of "Functional Sports Training." Vern's coaching experience spans 43 years at all levels of competition. He has authored over 100 articles and nine books on various aspects of training. He received his BA from Fresno State University and his teaching credential with a coaching minor from University of California Santa Barbara. Vern later attended Stanford University and obtained his MA in Education with an emphasis in physical education.



FRANS BOSCH earned a degree in PE in 1977. Thereafter he was employed as a physical education teacher before becoming a self-employed expressive artist, in particular as a painter and as a medical illustrator. Since 1980 he worked in athletics, coaching elite sprinters and Olympic high jumpers and for some years as the national coach for jumping events. Since 2005 Bosch teaches at the Fontys University for applied sciences in sports, mainly in the field of anatomy, biomechanics, strength training and motor learning. Bosch frequently works internationally as consultant in sport and as conference speaker on training related subjects.

Travel

The nearest international airport is Vaasa (110 km from Kuortane) and the nearest domestic airport is Seinäjoki (45 km). Bus or taxi transport will be organized from/to the airports. There is also a train connection from Helsinki to Seinäjoki (app. 2 hours 40 min).

Conference Fee

- Registrations by 30th September 290 euros, after October the 1st 330 euros
- The price includes accommodation in double rooms for two days, meals, the conference program and materials. Single room accommodation is available for an additional 30 euros/day.
